- Specific to:** St. Mary's Catholic Secondary School graduate with OSSD
- Amount of Award:** \$250
- History:** Cassandra Hawkins and her family died tragically from carbon monoxide poisoning in December 2008. They were described by friends as "the type of family that were always ready, willing, and able to help those in need and they could often be found volunteering with big, welcoming grins on their faces." Specific to: A secondary school student who is a resident of Oxford County at the secondary school level, upon their successful graduation.

Amount of Award: \$1,900

History: The late George Roberts was “just a farmer from north of Embro” who met his future bride, Lorna Thompson while they were completing their degrees at the University of Guelph. George & Lorna Roberts valued the importance of education and established a fund at Oxford Community Foundation (OCF) in 2013. Each year, a bursary is awarded from the OCF George & Lorna Roberts Fund.

Criteria: The recipient will be a graduating student who:

- must be enrolled at The Ontario Agriculture College at the University of Guelph and/or the Department of Family Relations and Applied Nutrition in the College of Social & Applied Human Sciences at the University of Guelph

- combination of education and community involvement would be preferable

- Amount of Award:** \$350 (The recipient will provide verification of enrollment in a Developmental Services Worker program at a college)
- History:** Established in November 2007 by the Board of Directors of Woodstock and District Developmental Services in recognition of the outstanding leadership demonstrated and contributions to services for people with developmental disabilities by Rosemary George, retired Executive Director.
